

Information on cookies files for the AMILIGHT online store

1. The store does not automatically collect any information, except for information contained in cookies.
 2. Cookies (called "cookies") should be understood as IT data, in particular text files, which are stored in the end-user device of the Store and are intended for use on the Store's websites. Cookies contain, among others, the name of the website from which they originate, the time of their storage on the terminal device and a unique number.
 3. Cookies are used to:
 - a) matching the content of the Store websites to the individual preferences of the User. In particular, these files allow to recognize the User's device to display the Store's pages in accordance with his expectations
 - b) creating anonymous statistics excluding the possibility of user identification. These statistics help to understand how Users use the websites of the Store, which allows improving the structure and content of these websites
 - c) maintaining the Store User session (after logging in), thanks to which the User does not have to enter the login and password on each subpage of the Store
 4. By default, software used for browsing websites allows cookies to be placed on the User's end device by default. These settings can be changed by the User in such a way as to block the automatic handling of cookies in the web browser's settings or inform them about each time they are sent to user device.
 5. The Shop Administrator informs that changes to the default settings in the User's Internet browser (in particular, blocking the automatic handling of cookies) may prevent the proper operation of the Shop websites.
